1. SAUTE Annual General Meeting 2023

Fribourg, 6 May 2023, 9.00-10.30

1. Minutes of 2022 General Assembly

The minutes are approved unanimously (21 votes in favour, 0 absents, 0 against).

2. Treasurer's Report and Auditors' Report

The treasurer presents the financial report for 2022 (balance 31.12.2022: CHF 31'103.75) noting that expenses were comparatively high due to a backlog of SAGW refunds and the SAUTE 75th anniversary activities. She exhorts members to report their activities for the SAGW report, so as to provide documentation of funded activities.

Crispin Thurlow points out that the expenses for “The Art of Language” (6-7.7.22) (5470.-) were not exclusively for the dinner, but for the whole conference.

The treasurer's report is accepted (20 votes in favour, 0 against, 1 abstention).

The auditors' report by Rahel Orgis and David Correia Saavedra is likewise accepted (20 votes in favour, 0 against, 1 abstention).

3. New SAUTE Members

The new members are welcomed with a warm applause.

4. SAUTE Membership and Procedures

The president presents the new membership procedures developed by the board:

1. Payment of annual membership fees in January; reminder in February/March; strict deadline: 15 March
2. SAUTE membership and mailing list are updated after the AGM in April/May. This list will also serve as the basis for the ESSU booklet and the payments SAUTE makes to ESSE. SAUTE members who have missed the deadline will be considered “nonactive members” and excluded from membership privileges until the next calendar year.

Andreas Jucker clarifies that non-membership for ESSE depends on the preceding year, so someone who is not a SAUTE member in 2023 would not be able to apply, for instance, for ESSE book prizes in 2024. New members will be invited to pay the membership fee after their acceptance into SAUTE (but still enjoy full membership privileges for the given year).

The new procedure is put to the vote and accepted (25 in favour, 0 against, 2 abstentions). Non-present members will be informed by email.

5. SPELL

Ina Habermann, general editor of SPELL, reports on the transition of SPELL from Narr Francke Attempto Verlag to Winter Verlag and the concomitant change to gold open access online publication, which has been smooth and without problems. There will be no print publication of the SPELL henceforth due to financial considerations, but all things considered, gold open access publication promises to increase the visibility of SPELL in general. As the general editor further points out, open access publication will be obligatory for SAGW funding as of 2024. Previous volumes of SPELL are archived and freely accessible at E-Periodica, hosted by ETH Zurich.

6. Travel Awards

The board has received three applications for 2022, all of which were approved:

- Lara Portmann, UNIBE (CHF 500.-)
- Guðrun í Jákupsstovu, UNIBE (CHF 500.-)
- Jennifer Smolka, UNIFR (USD 100.-)

As of 2021, it has been possible, in light of COVID-19, to apply for funding for archival work or digitization fees. The question is brought up whether, in addition to travel restrictions, ecological reasons might equally serve as a legitimate reason to fund such non-travel-related expenses. It is suggested that the extension of fundable expenses should therefore be made permanent, which would also call for a new name (“travel and resources award”). In addition, the pool for the award could be increased from 2'000.- to 3'000 (plus donations).

These suggestions are put to the vote and accepted unanimously (29 in favour, 0 abstentions, 0 against).

7. 75th SAUTE Anniversary in 2022: Feedback and Outlook

The Feedback collected on the occasion of the 75th SAUTE anniversary was discussed by the board and the working group, with two clear strands emerging:

1. Desire for a closer collaboration with SATE and secondary school teachers in general. This could take the form of:
 - a) inviting teachers to attend events at university.
 - b) university teachers visiting schools, e. g. conducting workshops.
 - c) SATE additionally suggests workshops with teachers, or collaboration on creating teaching materials, as there appears to be a demand from presses such as OUP. It is pointed out, however, that open access might be a factor to keep in mind when publishing such materials.A working group dedicated to deepening these suggestions will be created.
2. Desire to look into the relationship between English Studies and Digital Humanities: a roundtable will be organized in the near future to assess the current status and perspectives for the future.

8. Curricular Matters: Digital Tools in Teaching

Julia Straub and Martin Mühlheim present an initiative (primarily conceived by Martin Mühlheim) on digital tools in teaching, an enquiry into the potential for joining forces and sharing digital teaching resources more widely through the SAUTE platform. Coordinating the

communication for events such as online seminars, workshops, and lecture series through SAUTE (e.g. with one person per department responsible for channeling relevant information) might be a way to assemble and communicate resources in a more centralised fashion in order to reach a wider audience for these events. An email will be sent out to departments to recruit members for a working group with the purpose of exploring the potential of this initiative in more depth. It is planned that the working group should meet twice before reporting their findings to the November 2023 SAUTE meeting.

9. Next Biennial Conference in Bern in 2025

The next SAUTE conference will take place in Bern in 2025 and will be dedicated to the topic “Listening to Africa: Englishes in the Global South.” The conference organisers, Zoë Lehmann Imfeld and Crispin Thurlow, present the topic and distribute a flyer. They are keen to emphasise that there is no need to be an expert on Africa in order to make a meaningful contribution to the conference.

The following SAUTE conferences will take place in Lausanne (2027) and Geneva (2029), respectively.

10. News from the SAGW and the Lang-Lit Fachportal

The president reports on a number of SAGW-funded events and activities, including the 75th anniversary celebrations (celebrated by both SAUTE and SAGW in 2022) and the Lang-Lit initiative on multilingualism.

The SAWG anniversary initiatives include:

- a signet, a history of the academy, a big event at the Waisenhausplatz Bern on 17 September 2022, the series “La Suisse existe – La Suisse n’existe pas” with the theme “Verantwortungsvoller(-loser) Konsum” (SDG), interactive format regarding monuments;

The SAUTE representative in the Lang-Lit website working group (Kilian Schindler) reminds SAUTE members that the portal is eager to promote research projects, especially in the area of digital humanities. 11. News from the European Society for the Study of English (ESSE)

The 16th ESSE conference took place in 2022 in Mainz, Germany. The next conference will take place in 2024 (26-30 August) in Lausanne. Crispin Thurlow will co-lead a workshop in the run-up to the Lausanne conference.

- Proposals for parallel lectures from national associations have to be submitted by 15 June 2023.
- Proposals for seminars and roundtables from prospective convenors have to be submitted by 15 June 2023
- Individual papers for seminars have to be submitted to seminar convenors by 31 January 2024.
- Individual posters: 31 January 2024.
- Applications to the Doctoral Symposium have to be submitted to Professor J. Lachlan Mackenzie (Lachlan_mackenzie@hotmail.com) by 31 January 2024.
- Registration will begin on 1 March 2024.

Andreas Jucker reminds SAUTE members that the prizes for the book awards will be awarded in Lausanne, too. Deadline: January/February 2024, for books published in 2022-23. The financial situation of ESSE is healthy, if not too healthy due to the pandemic. Expenses will be expanded for the causes for which ESSE stands (including numerous grants, as detailed on the ESSE website).

12. Webmaster's Report

The webmaster stresses that he is happy to upload any announcements (guest lectures, workshops, etc.) to the website and further suggests that the page for job advertisements on the website could be made more visible and kept up to date with any job advertisements that are circulated via the SAUTE mailing list.

13. ESSU Booklet

The ESSU booklet is in progress. Martin Mühlheim expresses warm thanks to Emily Smith for her active role in the transition of responsibilities in this regard.

14. News from Doctoral Programmes

Enough proposals have been submitted to CUSO for the coming year, so the call for applications will not be extended.

The University of Basel has been forced to leave CUSO and now entertains a doctoral programme in linguistics with Freiburg i. Br. (Hermann Paul School of Linguistics Basel-Freiburg). A literature-oriented doctoral school (including German, French, Italian literary studies) contains c. 45 members and provides seed money (one year, usually) to doctoral students. The GRACE programme is a further roof above all doctoral programmes and focuses on financing doctoral studies, transferable skills, exchanges between subjects, etc.

In Zurich, the graduate campus is now organized at level (as opposed to departmental level), which has led to some regrettable disconnections in communication.

15. News from Member Universities
